 Please God to Bless me with in this Life
 I give and bequeath the same as follows For
 the first Place I bequeath unto my Wife
 Agnes Buchanan third third of all that
 I Possess and the Rest to be Equally Divided
 amongst the Children at the discretion of the
 Juridicum I do hereby Constitute Make Make
 and Ordain my Wife Agnes & Nicola Buchanan
 to be my sole Executors of this my last
 Will and Testament and I do hereby Revoke &
 make Void all other Wills and Testaments
 Ratifying and Confirming this and none other to
 be my last Will and Testament. In Witness
 Whereof I the said William Buchanan have
 hereunto set my hand and Seal the day and
 Year of Our Lord One thousand Seven hundred
 and Ninety seven.
