Item I give my soul to god Almighty God my Body to be Buried at the discretion of my Executors here after mentioned Item, I give to my son John Ten Shillings to him and his heirs forever.

Item, I give to my son Thomas & heirs Ten Shilling to them and their heirs forever.

Item, I give to my Daughter Agnes six Shilling to her & her heirs forever.

Item, I give to my Daughter Mary six Shilling to her and her heirs forever.

Item, I give to my son James his heirs six Shillings to them & their heirs forever.

Item I give to my son ^{Alexander} all that Remains of my Real & personal estate to him & his heirs forever.

Lastly I do Constitute my friends William Collins and John Caldwell Executors of this my last will and Testament as witness my hand and seal this 2nd day of July 1803.
