In the name of God amen
I Isaac Mullens of Wayne County and
State of Kentucky being very sick, though
of perfect mind and memory calling to mind
the Mortality of my body and knowing
that it is appointed once for all men to die
do make and ordain this my last will and
Testament, that is to say, first of all I
give and bequeath to Mary my wife
full possession of my land I now live on
Negroes and such part of the stock as my
wife sees proper to keep for the family support
During her widowhood and when she marries
if that she be ever then she has her first choice
of my Negroes and the one third of my land
her lifetime and the third of the stock and all
the housewell furniture to be my wife during
her life, the remaining negroes and property
to be equally divided amongst my Children
when the youngest Child comes of age, and
each Child to have its respective part of
money as they come of age, I leave to my
Mother Eight pounds a year during her life
