Also what Iron tools belonging to the Estate to be divided equally Between them I also give ~~unto~~ one bed and Clothing to the two boys I also give unto my Daughter Jenny her mare and Cow Bed and Clothing. Then after my Debts are satisfied the rest of my Estate Money and property except the Hogs to be collected in the property exposed to publick Sale and an equal Division made of the whole amongst all the Old woman & all the Children I do hereby Constitute appoint and Ordain Thomas Smiley and James Alcorn executors of this my last will and Testament In witness whereof I have here unto set my hand and affixed my seal this twentyfourth day of January 1802

And on the Motion of Thomas Smilie and James Alcorn the Executors therein named Certificates is granted that for obtaining a probate thereof in due form upon their giving Security whereupon they came personally into Court with Zacharias Barnett & Richard Gooding their securities and entered into and acknowledged Bond in the penalty of \$500 Conditioned as the Law directs for the Due and faithful Administration of said Deceaseds Estate and performance of his Will
