I give my son George one nother young breeding Mare to make out of her what he can for his own benefit after my death to be his hoiseship but not to sell her without my will. — Likewise I give a nother young Mare to my son Daniel to raise all the benefit out of her for his own benefit but not to sell her with out my will after my Death

to be his own. — Likewise I give another young mare to my son Christian to raise all the benefit out of her for his own benefit but not to sell her without my will.

This is my last Will. Witness my hand this day the first Day of March 1806

I Samuel Denny of the State of Kentucky and Wayne County, being frail in body though in sound mind and memory; Calling to mind that I have to die I do make and ordain this my last will and Testament making void all other Wills formerly by me made. I give my soul to Almighty God who gave it my will is that my body shall have a Christian like Burial at the expense of my

Exors if present; and if not by my friends then present. — I do make and appoint my beloved wife Elizabeth and my son William my exors to settle all my worldly affairs as follows to wit, — my will is that all my Just and lawfull debts be Justly paid I leave my beloved wife to have the power to consent to sell my land or not any time forbid the sale During her life and to have one third of the profits of said place during her life with the bedding and house affairs Necessary for housekeeping and house if she requires it; with a certain Bay horse known by the name of Dick. — I leave to my beloved sons Benj.ⁿ and Esariah my land to be equally divided between them after the Decease of their Mother; Also I leave to them Each a Mare to wit a Gray to Esariah and a Bay to Benj.ⁿ now called their property; I leave all my live Stock that not heretofore Spoken of in the hands of my sons to wit Benj.ⁿ and Esariah for their support and to enable them to pay the state price of the land and in case one or both should Marry I wish the fore mentioned Stock to be divided in three equal shares

Between them both and their Mother and each to have their third part. — I leave all the Balance of my live Stock after the state price of the land is paid to be equally divided between all my children to wit John Samuel Wm Sarah Benj.ⁿ and Esariah for which purpose I do set my hand and seal this 17th day of August ^{in the year 1806} 1806
