 named Queen and her Increase and five hundred and fifty
 two and a half Acres of Land ^{out of the spot} that I am to have of Anthony Thomp-
 son to be Equal in Quality with the said Land that I am to
 have of the said Thompson, but in case the said Land is lost she
 is to have fifty Pounds in lieu thereof out of my other Lands
 to her and her heirs forever.
