In the name of God Amen, I Charles Pemberton of the County of Woodford and State of Virginia, being a sole State of health, tho of sound mind and perfect memory, not knowing the uncertainty of this earthly life, do make this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following,

Item, I lend and bequeath unto Sarah Pemberton my Dear and beloved Wife during her natural life One negro fellow named Sambo. One negro fellow named Sam. One negro wench named Dinah. One negro wench named Hannah. One negro child named Daffy, and One negro Girl named Lett, and One negro boy named Randolph four cows & calves three feather Beds. One horse and two

monies. together with all household furniture during her natural life. I then divided as I shall hereafter mention, I then I give unto my Daughter Delph Gatewood two Shillings Sterling to her and her heirs lawfully begotten of her body forever. I then I give unto my Daughter Elizabeth Edwards One Negro Girl named Sally. to her and her heirs lawfully begotten of her body forever. also One Negro Wench named Daffney after mine and my Wife's death. Also an equal part of all the Stock & household furniture that remains at the death of my wife. I then I give unto my Son Bennet Pemberton. One Negro boy named Edmund. One Negro Girl named Lucy. Also One large Bible and my Riding Saddle and all my wearing clothes and ^{my} shot gun. Also an equal part of all Stock and household furniture after my death, I then I give unto my Daughter Nancy Ann. One Negro Girl named Judy to her and her heirs lawfully begotten of her body forever. Also One Negro Girl named Lett after my and my wife's death. Also an equal part of all Stock and household furniture that remains

at the death of my wife. I then my Will and desire is. that if Henry Gatewood obtains his false and Groundless Suit. he has brought against me. or I hear has brought against me. for a certain Negro man named Daffney. Increase which I never promised which Negroes I have left to Elizabeth Edwards and Nancy Ann. now if the said Edwards and Ann. should lose the above Negroes. left to them. by said suit. my Will and desire is. that Elizabeth Edwards should have a certain negro boy name Randy bequeath to my wife. if he loses those already bequeathed by said suit, I then my Will and desire is that if Gatewood obtains the negroes as before mentioned that my son Bennet Pemberton. Give up one of the Negroes bequeathed to him. by the name of Lucy to Nancy Ann. for her heirs forever. The other by the name of Edmund. to remain the property of my son Bennet Pemberton. and his heirs forever. also at the Death of my Wife Sarah Pemberton all the Negroes then living. and Increase if any. not bequeath to some one of my children to be equally divided. Together with what stock and household furniture is left between my Daughter Elizabeth

Edwards and my son Bennet Pemberton and my daughter Nancy Owen. But should the negroes, to wit, Dickey, Lett, Selah, and Judah never be obtained by Galewood, nor Garnett, then my Will and desire is that my estate be divided as is first mentioned in my Will. Item, I constitute and appoint my son Bennet Pemberton to be my whole and sole Executor of this my Last Will and Testament, & I do make void & disannul all other Wills and Testaments before made he being to pay my Legacies and discharge them as before mentioned. In Witness Whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this eleventh day of January in the year of Our Lord and Saviour One thousand seven hundred and ninety.
