tation lying on the West side of Scotts Road, so as not to inter-
fere with the East side of the said Road
any of the ^{land} give unto my four Sons, Edmund, Samuel,
Mathias and Powhatan four thousand acres of my last
Land to be equally divided among them agreeable to Quan-
tity and Quality. — I leave it in the power of my
Executors to sell or exchange any part of my estate, Real
