 County State of Virginia being weak of body but of sound memory
 before he god on this 27th day of May 1790 make and publish
 this my last will and Testament in manner following viz
 first I give and bequeath to my Son David the tract of Land
 on which I now live to be by him enjoyed if he lives to the age
 of twenty one, if he die before he be of age, the land to be
 divided equally among my surviving Daughters, also I give unto
 my beloved wife Elizabeth the negro wench named Becky to
 be disposed of as she shall see fit, also all the moveable property
 (except one house to be given to my Son John when he comes
 for it) which property she is to have at her disposal for the
 maintainance of the children as she shall remain unmarried,
 but if she shall marry, the whole property except the
 negro and cow above mentioned shall be sold, and she
 shall have the third of all, and the remainder shall be
 equally divided among my Daughters, my wife is to
 have the use of the Land for the support of the family
 until my son David be of age, and if she remain
 single she is to have her own maintenance off it during
 her life, and I do appoint the she my said wife together
 with my brother Jonathan shall be Executors of this my
