Will.

In the name of god Amen; I George Rice late of the
County of Frederick and State of Virginia and now of the
County of Woodford, Kentucky, being in low state of
health but of sound mind and memory do make &
Declare this my last Will & Testament, In witness whereof
and desire that of my personal estate the whole or some
may be sold as will pay all my Just debts, and if there
be not sufficient personal estate for that purpose, then
such part of my real estate to be sold as will make up
that deficiency provided that none of my Negroes is
hereby meant to be sold, in any case,

2^d My will and desire is that my Father shall con-
tinue to live in the Family during his life, and that
if he requires it that he be paid ten pounds per Annum

3^d I give and devise one certain Tract or parcel of
Land containing sixteen hundred sixty six & two thirds
Acres lying on the Ohio & purchased of Henry Banks
Who derives his title from John Champ Carter, Also
my half of Pierce Holland's Land, which is One thou-
sand three hundred thirty three & one third Acres
Also sixteen hundred Acres of Land purchased of John
Adams lying on the Waters of Flatte Water - Also
an entry of twelve hundred Acres of Land Cumberland
in the State Military line Warrant assigned to me
by John Harvis Also One thousand thirty three &
One third Acres of Land in the name of John
Maughter the same being Surveyed and patented in

the name of Amos Waggoner And all expences both
for this and that of Piers Wolens. already paid by me to
my Brother John Rice four sons and their heirs forever
in payment for the Land which my said Brother John
willed to be sold, and the money to be laid out in -
Western Lands.

4th I give and devise all my estate in Land lying on
the Western Waters to my six Children to be equally
divided among them, and their heirs forever provided that
Should any of my said Children before or on the coming of
age or marry then in that case the part of such Child
to be equally divided among the Survivors of my said Children

5th I give and devise a certain Tract of Land contain-
ing One thousand three hundred thirty three and one third
Acres being one half of a Tract in partnership with Robt.
Hollinsworth, to my four Nieces, Mary Rice, Mary Rice,
Elizabeth Boyce & Jane Sullivan now the wife of
William Sullivan and their heirs forever

6th I give and devise the Quantity of five hundred
Acres of Land to my Brother Edmund Rice and his heirs
forever to be taken out of the above general devise to my
six Children in such manner as my Brother Edmund
and Children can agree -

7th My will and desire is that my wife Elizabeth so
long as she shall remain my widow shall remain on
my plantations in the County of Frederick and that

to keep and bring up my said children until they respectively attain the age of twenty one years upon the proceeds of my said plantation & the labour of the negroes -

My will and desire is that a Waggon & gears and set of the best horses be reserved and not for the use of the said plantation, & I do hereby appoint and declare my said Wife Elizabeth Executrix of Aforesaid Waggon & James McDonald John Miller & Micajah Roach - Executors of this my last Will and Testament August 1792

In the name of God Amos Thomas Johnson of Woodford County district of Kentucky being weak in body but of sound memory Blesed be god do this day - August 1792 Twenty fourth in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and Ninety two make & publish this my last Will and Testament in the manner following, that is to say, First I give and bequeath unto my beloved Wife Elizabeth one third of my personal Estate also she is to superintend and manage all my personal Estate and Clear Land till my eldest son become of age; Secondly, I give and bequeath unto my eldest son David Three hundred Acres of land of the place I now live on, to be taken at his pleasure of either line he chooses when he come of age, Also I give and bequeath unto my son Silas Two hundred and Fifty Acres at his own choice which ever of David's line he sees cause to begin at so that his own line may still David's side live that the lines may be equal and no Vacant Land Between Also I give and bequeath unto my four Daughters Mary, Anna, Betsey & Sally the residue of my Land four hundred Acres to be equally divided among them four, All my personal estate horses Cows, Sheep &c. are to be at my Wife disposal until the children are of age or shall be so with her situation and for the present she shall have privilege with my other Executors to appoint out as my present stock as will be sufficient to Build a house for her and the children
