Nicholas Holman five shillings. I give unto my Son Edward
Holman three hundred Acres of Land where he now lives -
providing none of the presumption shall be lost by Lane what
ever part shall be lost he must pay his share of the Costs and
return five Acres for every ten Acres that shall be taken from
said presumption by Law then the three hundred Acres or
whichever part accordingly to save Edward Holman a his
Heirs forever. I will and Bequeath the remaining part
of said presumption to be sold and the money to be personal
with my personal Estate. I will and Bequeath unto my
three daughters Rozetta, Elizabeth and Mary Holman
five shillings a piece. I will and Bequeath to my three
Sons William Isaac and Isaac Holman twenty five pounds
for to purchase Lands over the Ohio if I shall not save yet
there myself to buy Lands for them and their Heirs forever
I will and Bequeath all my Estate both real & personal
to warrant and defend according to this my Last Will and

said presumption to them and their Heirs forever. I will
and Bequeath unto my three Sons William Isaac and
Isaac Holman and four daughters Sarah Ann Lane
Martha Holman all my remaining personal Estate con-
fise shillings for Edward Holman for his part of my
personal Estate my daughter Mary Holman alone must
to have her cattle and articles to the value of as much of
my personal Estate as her sisters received that are paid and
married. Rozetta and Elizabeth my beloved Wife Lane
Holman is give up her part of my real Estate at her death
and not to take any rent from those that I sold Lands to
and not Andrew. Also I do hereby appoint my beloved
Son Edward Holman and David Dant Robins Receiv-
my whole and sole Executors of this my Last Will and
Testament In Witness whereof I the said Henry Ho-
doth grant this to be my Last Will and Testament I
