I give unto my next obedience Brother one negroe Girl named Lucy to her & her heirs Lawfully Begotten of her Body forever But if either of the first above children should die without heir Lawfully Begotten then my Will and desire is that the negroe left them and their increase if any shall be equally Divided between the Surviving heirs Item. I give and Bequeath my Friend John Brown all the money that is in his hands of mine on account of Land sold in the Settlemnt together with all Bonds and debts that may be due to me to him & his heirs Lawfully begotten of his body forever and Lastly I constitute and appoint my friends John Brown Wm Brown my
