 him Applied for the Support of my Children at his Discretion -
 until my Youngest Child shall arrive to full age and then to
 be Divided or sold at the Discretion of my said Executor and
 Equally Divided between all my Children that shall be then living
 and Also my said Wife this part of my Estate I Wish to be Equally
 Divided at her Death between all my Children that shall be then
 living - And I do hereby constitute and appoint my loving Wife
 Suckey and my friend John Ellis my full and Whole Executors
 to this Last Will and Testament as above mentioned, In Witness
 Whereof I have hereunto set my hands and seal this twenty third day
