I Joseph Johnson of Taylors County and State of Virginia, of sound and perfect memory do make and Ordain this my last will and Testament, and after the payment of all my just debts and funeral charges, I give my body to the dust and my soul to God that gave it, and for the things of this world that it hath pleased almighty God to bless me with, I give and bequeath in manner following, that is to say, I give to my beloved wife Mary the third part of my real and personal estate, and to my beloved Son Benjamin, I give a third part, and to the child that my beloved wife is pregnant with, I give the other third part in case she should be delivered of the same, be it boy or girl; and in case either of the Children should die before they <sup>shall</sup> come to full age, their part to be equally divided between my other child and my beloved wife, and my will is that my children should be well educated by my Executors hereafter mentioned, and I do make and Ordain my beloved wife Mary, whole and sole Executrix of this my last will and Testament, as witnesses whereunto I have
