

In the name of God Amen I Timothy Driskill of the County of Woodford State of Kentucky being weak in body but of perfect mind and memory; And calling to remembrance the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed unto all men once to die. Do make and Ordain this, ^{to be} my last will & Testament; And as touching such worldly Estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life I give demise & bequeath the same in the following manner and form; first. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Amy Driskill one Bay Filly one Cow and Calf and thirty Pounds of feathers. Second I give and bequeath unto my son Elijah Driskill, one small Roan last springs Colt, and also to him the said Elijah and my other two sons Joniah & Dennis One hundred and fifty Acres of land each, out of two tracts one on the Waters of Kingstons forks oficking containing seven hundred Acres & the other of two hundred Acres on the Waters of State Creek. And if there

shall be more than four hundred and fifty Acres of land obtained and secured then the overplus is to be equally divided amongst my seven Daughters, Priscilla, ^{Gadsh} Sarah Plough, Amy, Elizabeth, Anne, Polly & Rebecca Driskill and I give also to each of my said Daughters One Acre of Land as a piece. Thirdly I give and bequeath unto my beloved Wife Priscilla Driskill all the rest of my moveable Estate with the tract of land whereon I now live during her natural life to dispose of it as she may think best (excepting the future increase of my Grey Mare, which increase is to be given to my two Youngest Sons & four youngest Daughters) and after the decease of my said Wife, the Property hereby given to her is to be equally divided amongst my four youngest Daughters. Fourthly Lastly I constitute & appoint my Wife Priscilla Driskill Executor & Samuel Brooking & Isaac Ruddle Executors of this my last Will & Testament. And I do hereby disallow make & disannul

all and every others will or well Entailed
or Testaments heretofore by me made—
ratifying and Confirming this and no other
to be my last will & Testament.

at the Courthouse the first day of March
1796. This last Will and Testament of
Timothy Driskill was presented in Court
and proved by the oaths of James Garnett
and William Garnett Witnesses thereto and
Ordered to be Recorded; And on the motion
of Tricilla Driskill & Samuel Brooksing the
Executrix & one of the Executors, ^{therein} named
who made oath according to law, and together
with James Garnett & Edmund Searcy their
Securities, entered into and acknowledged bond in
the penalty of \$1000 Conditioned as the law
directs Certificate is granted them for obtaining
probate thereof in due form; & Liberty is reserved to

In the name of God Amen. I Thomas²⁵⁹
Sullinger of Woodford County being sick
and weak in body but of perfect sound
mind and memory do make and Ordain
this my last will and Testament in
manner and form as followeth—

First I give my Soul to God who
gave it me. First of all trusting in
Jesus Christ for eternal life. And my Body
I leave to be buried at the discretion
of my Executors hereafter mentioned. And
as to what worldly Goods it hath pleased
God to bless me with. I give & dispose
of it in the manner following—

Item I lend to my Mother, ^{therein} Sullinger a
certain part of my tract of land. Beginning
at the Spring rising thence to include
her guardian to the fence, thence along
the said fence to the dividing fence—
between the fields called, ^{the other part of the plantation,} Hott's field and
thence ^{the said} North 20 E to the back line thence
thence S 70 E along the said line to a Hickory
and Sugar Tree Corner to Richard Fox
thence S 20 W opposite to the said
