and ordain this my last will and Testament
in manner and form following, that is to say
1st I desire that all my Hives, Cattle and Hogs,
and my present Crop, be immediately sold
after my decease, and out of the monies
arising therefrom, all my Just debts, and
funeral expenses be paid. Should my said
Stock and Crop as aforesaid be insufficient for
the above purpose, then I desire that my
Executors hereafter named may convert as much
of the monies arising from the sale of my
Land and plantation (which has been sold
by Joseph Delaney for the sum of fifteen
Hundred pounds) as will make up the defi-
ciency, then the balance of all the monies
arising from my estate be equally divided
amongst my four Daughters, to wit, Polly
Field, Laura Field, Sally Field, and
Elizabeth Field, to them and the Lawfull
Heirs of their Body forever.

I will and desire that all my negroes, to wit,
John, Nancy, Minny, Diddy, Lucy, Benjamin

Elizargay, and Gabriel, them and their Issues
be equally divided among my said four
Daughters and their Lawfull Heirs, when my
eldest surviving Daughter shall marry a man
at lawfull age.

3^d If any of my Daughters shall die after a
division shall take place as above mentioned
before they have a Lawful Issue from their
body, I then will and desire that all their
part or parts, portion or portions of my estate
may be equally divided among my surviv-
ing Children.

4th My Will and desire further is, that if my
Executors shall think proper to sell my said
negro woman named Nancy they are at
Liberty so to do out of the monies
arising from such sale, to purchase another
young negro woman in her place to be
distributed among my Children as above
mentioned.

And lastly, I do hereby constitute and
appoint my Friends Thomas M. Clannahan,
Sam^l, Willis Field, and Richard Fox, my
whole and sole Executors of this my last
will and Testament, and also Guardians of
my aforesaid four Daughters, hereby revoking
all other former wills and Testaments
by me heretofore made. In Witness
