 dissolution of my body do make this my last will and
 testament. In the first place I commend my soul into
 the hands of God who gave it, and my body to the
 dust in hopes of its resurrection and reunion with
 my soul to inherit eternal life through the merits
 and mediation of our Lord Jesus Christ the only
 and all sufficient Saviour of sinful Mankind.
 As for the possessions with which it has pleased
 God to bless me in this World, I dispose of them
 in the following manner Viz. I bequeath that my
 Negro boy Peter shall be sold to pay my leg¹ debts
 I further bequeath to my son Isaac Nathaniel Harris
 all his and my Daughters his share of my
 my two Horses my beds and beds furniture and House
 and kitchen furniture of every kind. I give the whole
 and separate to my son James Howard five shillings
 to be paid out of my Estate by my Executors and further
 declare that what I have herein devised to my
 children respectively is in full and sole Compensation
 of all claims and demands that they shall set up to any
 other or further part of my Estate. Finally I hereby
 nominate constitute and appoint my son in Law
 Nathaniel Harris alias and William Hicks to be
 Executors of this my last Will and testament hereby
 revoking and Disannulling all former Wills by me
 made. In Witness Whereof I have hereunto set my
 hands this 10th day of November 1795.
