Nancy Sullenger the Negro Girl named Lucenna Valued at one Hundred Dollars & to Monah Sullenger the Negro Boy named Adam Valued at Eighty Dollars and as by the will the said negroes were to be equally divided between the said three Legates; Betsey Sullenger in consequence of this Allotment, stands indebted to Nancy Sullenger in the sum of one pound six Shillings & Eight Pence, and to Monah Sullenger in the sum of seven Pounds six Shillings & Eight Pence

The remainder of the Estate of the deceased is either Vested for life in other Legates or is not susceptible of Division without a Sale

Will

I John Lee of the County of Woodford and State of Kentucky, being of sound and disposing mind memory and understanding do make and ordain this my last will and Testament. First, I give and bequeath unto my son John H. Lee my tract of Land lying in the forks of Elk River Creek in this County of Franklin containing five Hundred and fifty acres. Secondly, I give and bequeath unto my son Thomas D. Lee my tract of Land on which I now reside in the said County of Woodford containing Four Hundred and Thirty Eight acres. Thirdly, I give and bequeath unto my son Lewis Willis Lee my tract of Land containing one Thousand acres lying on Russell's Creek a branch of Green River. Fourthly, I give and bequeath

unto my daughter Mary B. Lee and Sarah C. Lee my tract of Land containing one thousand acres lying in the territory of the United States north east of the Ohio River, to be divided equally between them in point of Value. Also three hundred and thirty three and one third acres of my tract of land containing thirteen hundred and thirty three and one third acres lying on the south fork of Shaggs Creek a branch of Big Barron River which is a branch of Green River, and one hundred and sixty six and two thirds acres lying on Glens Creek a branch of the said Shaggs Creek. Fifthly, I give and bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth T. Lee and Lucinda Lee one thousand acres of my tract of Land containing thirteen hundred and thirty three and one third acres lying on the south fork of Shaggs Creek before mentioned, to be equally divided between them in point of Value. Sixthly, I give and bequeath unto my daughter Matilda Lee five hundred acres of my tract of land containing six hundred and sixty six and two thirds acres on Glens Creek before mentioned. The foregoing bequests of land to my children are to them and their heirs for ever, provided however, that the bequests of my sons John H. Lee and Thomas B. Lee are to be subject to the incumbrances herein specified. Seventhly, I give and bequeath unto my ^{only} beloved wife Elizabeth Lee in lieu of her right of dower in and to all my landed Estates but not in lieu of her right of dower in and to my Slaves and other personal property, for and during the term of her natural life the occupation and use of the tract of land on which I now reside as fully and amply as if it had not been devised to my said son Thomas B. Lee; except, that if my said wife should marry, or she should live untilt he shall attain to the age of Twenty one Years, on either of these events happening, the life estate held by her in that part of the said tract of land which lies on the southwesterly side of the Road

Road leading from Frontport to Lexington shall immediately cease and determine. Also I give and bequeath unto my said wife all my house hold and kitchen furniture, and I further give and bequeath unto my said wife for and during the term of her natural life, my Mulatto boy named William now in possession of George Rowland in Franklin County, and after her death, I give and bequeath the said boy to my son John H. Lee and to his heirs for ever. But notwithstanding this bequest of the said boy unto my said son John H. Lee and my said wife, it is my intention and desire that they both be entitled to receive and enjoy their full legal distributive share of all my other Slaves and personal estate not herein specially devised in the same manner as if this bequest had not been made. Eighthly, I give and bequeath to William T. Lee of the Town of Frontport and to his heirs forever my negro Girl named Jane now in his possession, and I also give and bequeath to him in like manner a Slave of the Value of thirty Pounds, to be delivered to him Ten years after the date hereof. Ninthly, I hereby constitute and appoint my said wife Elizabeth Lee Guardian of and to all my Children under the restrictions herein contained. Tenthly, I will authorize and direct my said wife as Guardian to my Children to keep, work, employ and use such and so many of all my Slaves, Stock of Horses, neat Cattle, Sheep, Hogs, and various Carriages and plantations Tools, as my Executors herein after named shall permit, on my said tracts of Land in Woodford and Franklin Counties, to Enable her to maintain, educate and support my Children untilt they shall severally attain the age of Twenty one years or marry; and also of necessary to aid in defraying the taxes and other costs and Expenses which may accrue on my estate real and personal: provided that my said son John H. Lee shall have right to demand and take possession of the tract of Land herein devised to him when he attains the age of

of twenty one years; also that my said son Thomas B. Lee shall have right to demand and take possession of the several parts of the trust of land herein devised to him at the times before prescribed; and also that my said wife when ever she thinks proper, and each of my children when they respectively attain to the age of twenty one years or marry, shall have right to demand and receive, and not before, their several legal distributive shares of all my slaves and other personal estate then remaining alive, undisposed of, and not consumed or expended; and further, that should my said wife die before all my personal estate is thus distributed, it is my Will that the remainder thereof be considered as a common stock in the management of my other Executors for the purposes aforesaid. Eleventhly, I hereby authorize and direct my Executors herein nominated, or such of them as shall qualify, and the survivors of them, at the general costs of my estate to investigate and settle all disputes which may arise concerning any of my lands, either by suits or otherwise as he she or they shall deem just and proper. And in like manner I hereby empower them, to sell any or all of the lands herein, or which may be accruing to me, not herein specially devised, and to make deeds of conveyance therefor to the Purchasers, with general or special Warranty as he she or they shall think proper, and it is my Will that the monies arising from the sale shall be applied, at the discretion of my Executors, to reimburse such of my children as may chance to lose all or any part of the land herein devised to them by interference with superior claims, and the remainder

of the monies be equally divided between all my children. Finally, I nominate constitute and appoint my said wife Elizabeth Lee Executrix, and my friends Caleb Wallace and Robert Alexander Executors of this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking and annulling all & every former Will and Wills by me heretofore made, declaring and publishing this to be my only true and last Will and Testament, In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this eighteenth day of December one thousand eight hundred & one.

and three shap, and to make up small deficiencies
in the allotment his proportion of the slaves and
personal estate there is further allotted to him
a read sparring Heifer and a small brown
sparring steer.
