

156 At a Court held for Woodford County on the 2^d
day of August 1802.

In the name of God Amen I John
Stephenson of Woodford County and State of Kentucky
being weak in body of a sound mind and
memory calling to mind my mortal state and
knowing that all men are one to die I do make
and ordain this my last will and Testament
that is to say I give and recommend my soul to
almighty God from whence it came and my
body to the Earth to be buried in a decent Christian
manner at the discretion of my Executors
I had was touching my worldly Goods which I
now possess. I Give and dispose of the same
in the following manner and form: First I
will that all my lawful debts be paid out of
my estate as shall be hereafter be directed.

I Give unto my well beloved wife Margaret her
room in the house she now lives & a comfortable
subsistence from the plantation during her
natural life. Also one negro Girl named Abby
& her youngest child Isbell during life. After her
death to descend to my son James his heirs &c forever.
I also will that my wife have one bay mare
two cows the first choice of my stock & all the
house hold & Kitchen furniture to be at her disposal.

I Give my sons John & James two lots in the town
of Hartford to be equally divided aequally to the

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quality and quantity also seven sheep to my son
John.

To my sons Robert and
Thomas I Give five hundred acres of land on
Long Creek near Green river to be equally divided.
I bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth one negro
girl named Maria provided she may think
proper to take her otherwise she shall be at my
wifes disposal.

I Give to my sons James
and Thomas the plantation on which I live to
be equally divided each holding the one on
which they now live. Also to James one negro
man named Laban one black mare one horse
one bay filly two cows a second choice
all my farming tools to him his heirs &c forever.

I will that Thomas have one
half of all my wheat and four hundred lot of
porky next fall and one sorrel mare.

I will that the remainder of my cows hogs sheep
to be sold and the money coming to be appropriated
to the discharge of my debts & if there should
be a balance I will that it be divided equally
between my wife & children. I will that my
Grandson Hugh Stevenson (Rob^t's son) shall have
one negro boy named Frederick to him his
heirs forever. I do ordain & constitute
my sons Robert and James my Executors
of this will to be the same duty Executed

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And I do hereby utterly revoke disallow
disannul all wills heretofore made by me
I do hereby confirm ratify and establish
this my last will and Testament. In Testimony
whereof I have this eighteenth day of May
1802 at Athens and eight hundred and two declared
this my will signed my name and affixed my
seal in presence of
