Strange, David A. Strange, Nancy A. Strange, and Jesse A. Strange, When my two Oldest Children become of Age, It is my wish for a Division to take Place Viz One half of the money arising from my Personal Estate to be Equally Divided between my Two Oldest Children, First mentioned above, and when my Two Youngest become of Age The balance of my Personal Estate to be Equally Divided between them two, Nancy & Jesse, As for my Land Lying on the River in Campbell County It is my wish that it shall be Leased out until all my Four Children become of Age, and then to be Equally divided between all four above mentioned Children according to Quantity, and Quality, and if either of them should die without Law-

Laifull Issue then the money or Land to be Equally
Divided between them that is Surviving or
the Heirs of them Deceased Lawfully begetting of
this Body-- Lastly I appoint as Executors to
this my last Will and Testament, Byron
