it, And calling to mind the mortality of the
Body, and that it is appointed by God for all
men Once to die, Do make and Ordain this
my last Will and Testament, that is to say
First of all I recommend my soul to God
who gave it me, And for my I recommend
to the Earth, to be buried in a decent
manner at the discretion of my Executors
hereafter to be mentioned. And as touching
what worldly Goods it has pleased God to
give me in this life, I give devise and
dispose of in the following manner. —
Imprimis. It is my Will & desire &
I do Order that in the first place all
my just Debts & funeral charges be
Paid and Satisfied. Item I give

and bequeath unto my daughter Margaret
Black wife to Timothy Shearer ten Pounds
to be paid in any kind of property at
Cash Price to be paid her if demanded in
six months after my decease. Item I give
and bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth
Black wife to William Garnet ten Pounds
to be paid her in any kind of property -
when demanded. Item I give and bequeath
unto my daughter Martha Black wife
to Thomas Woods, ten Pounds to be -
paid her in any kind of Property at
Cash price. Item I give and bequeath
unto my daughter Mary Black wife
to Alexander Blair ten Pounds to be -
paid her in any kind of Property at
cash price. Item I give and bequeath
unto my daughters, Jennet Black and
Jean Black, all the land & plantation
that I now live on, which contains
137 Acres and a half, said land with
all the Houses buildings, and -
Purtenances belonging thereunto to them
or their heirs or assigns forever. I

likewise

likewise leave give and bequeath unto my
said two daughters, Jennet Black and Jean
Black all and every thing of my estate both
real and Personal, viz: Land and Houses
Household furniture, farming utensils, Horses
Cows, sheep, Hogs, and every other part of
my Estate, except what is above mentioned
to them and their heirs or assigns forever
Item if the land that I have given to
Garnet at Bond for, is lost, so that he the
said William Garnet does not, nor cannot obtain
it then it is my Will & I do Order
that my two daughters, Jennet Black
and Jean Black, do pay the said William
Garnett the value thereof. Item they are
to pay equal Part to the said William
Garnett. Provided said land is lost, as every
thing given and bequeathed unto them is to
be Equally divided, between them & their
heirs or assigns forever. And lastly I do
make, appoint and Ordain, my Trusty
friends William Garnett & my two Daughters
Jennet Black & Jean Black Executors
of this my last Will and Testament -
Signed Sealed, the Day & year

above Written in the presence of
us.

August 1796. This last Will and
Testament of Joseph Black Deceased
was presented in Court, proved by the
Oaths of William Young, William Scott
and Hugh Garrett, Witnesses thereto &
ordered to be recorded. For the motion
of William Garrett the Executor & Janet
Black & Jane Black the Executrixes
therein named, who made solemn
affirmation as the law requires &
together with William Young & Thomas
Wood their securities, entered into &
acknowledged Bond in the Penalty of
Six hundred Pounds. Conditioned as
the law directs. Certificate is granted
thereof for obtaining Probate thereof
in due form.
