debts and the payment of the following legacies
and I also Give & bequeath to Elizabeth Hamilton
my well beloved wife the third part of my land
and my negro servants viz Jack & Phillis & also
the one half of my goods Chattels & personal
estate, which my beloved wife Elizabeth Hamilton
is to hold during her life and then they are
to come to my son John after her decease
and if he should leave no heirs go to my Grand
Daughter Jean Smith as above directed

Also I give & bequeath unto my three Daughters
Ann Smith, Agnes Phillips, and Margaret
Thomson ten Shillings a piece, and I make
my well beloved wife Elizabeth Hamilton
and John Williams sole Executors of this
my last will and testament to take
care and to see the same performed according
to my true intent and meaning
