Sick but of perfect sound memory and calling to
mind the certainty of Death & uncertainty of life
do make constitute and appoint this my last will
and testament Revoking all other Will or Wills hereto-
fore made, and As to what worldly Estate I possess
I dispose of in the following manner
First I give and Bequeath unto my beloved wife Sarah Ruddell
the plantation whereon I now live containing one Hun-
dred & forty acres During her Natural life and after
her Decease I give and Bequeath the same to my son
Stephen Ruddell to be possessed by him and his Heirs
forever, & if my son Stephen Ruddell should die before
he comes to the age of Twenty one Years the said Land
to be sold and the Money to be Equally Divided
Between my son Isaac Ruddell & my son Cornelius
Ruddell & my Daughter Sarah Ruddell
Second I give and Bequeath unto my beloved wife
Sarah Ruddell all my stock and House hold Furniture
During her natural life and after her Decease I give
and Bequeath the same to my Daughter Sarah
Ruddell to her & her Heirs forever,

I give and Bequeath unto my beloved son Isaac Ruddell a
Bond that John Jackson of Woodford County has of
mine containing the sum of two hundred pounds
Cash to him and his Heirs for ever
And as touching my other Children James Ruddell
and Eliza & well Cornelius Ruddell and Anna
William Children having formerly given them
what I intended for them they are not to possess
any part of my Estate now in hand

I give and Bequeath unto my beloved wife a Negro
Woman named Malinda During her Natural life
and at her Decease my will and Desire is that
my beloved wife may dispose of said negro woman
as she may think proper

Item

My will and Desire is that my negro Man
Hampshire to be sold for the term of eight
Years from the date hereof and the money a-
rising from the sale of a Negro I give and Bequeath
unto my beloved Daughter Sarah Ruddell to her
and her Heirs forever, The said Hampshire at the
term of eight Years to be set at liberty

I know all men by these presents that I Joseph
Wilson of Woodford County and State of Ken-
tucky being of sound Judgment this thirtieth
of January One Thousand Eight Hundred and
Do constitute and appoint this my last Will
and Testament (to wit,

First I leave unto my beloved wife Sarah the
one Equitable Third part of the profits of the
plantation on which I live during her natural
life - And if the plantation should be sold as
hereafter shall be directed, in that case she is
to be entitled to the one Third of Interest of the
money so got or benefits of the third of the pro-
perty so purchased with the said money -

Also I leave unto my aforesaid wife the one Third
of all my personal Estate after my just debts
are paid and Twenty Pounds taken out
of it as shall hereafter bequeath

Secondly I leave unto my step Daughter Peggy Strutt
alias Peggy Mc Clelland Ten Pounds

Thirdly I leave unto my step Daughter Polly Mc Clelland
Ten Pounds

Fourthly I leave unto my two sons John and Samuel
a gentle suit of clothes each to be purchased
out of the money now owing to me

Fifthly I leave the Balance of my Estate let it what con-
sist of what it will equally between each of my
children

children that is to say Joseph, Peggy, John, Samuel
and Sarah except thirty Pounds which is to be deducted
out of Joseph's part which he has heretofore got in
two mans

Sixthly I authorize my Executors hereafter mentioned to sell
and convey the Land which I have in mason County
Also I authorize my Executors as a power to make the di-
viding line with Mr. Thomas Young and convey
to him agreeable to contract and take his conveyance
for the part that falls to me in the name of my heirs

Seventhly I appoint and constitute my wife Sarah and my son
inlaw John Strutt Executors to this my will and
Testament Witness my hand and seal this day
above written
