senses and knowing the uncertainty of this life do
make and ordain this my last will and testa-
ment in manner and form following (to wit)
First it is my desire that my wife live on
and keep possession of my house and plantation
whereon I now live with as much land join-
ing as she sees cause to work during her natural
life with as much stock of horses Cattle and
hogs as she sees cause to keep with all the plan-
tation Utensils with one Bed furniture and
house hold furniture Secondly it is my desire
that there be immediate paid out of my estate
to my Daughter Judy Eighteen pound cash
a Feather bed and furniture thirdly it is my
desire that my Daughter Polly shall have
out of my estate one horse worth eighteen
Pounds and saddle one Bed and furniture also to the
two Daughters Judy and Polly two cows out of
my stock to each of them fourthly it is my
desire that the land I now live on be equally
divid between my sons William & John and
that John have the upper part on which
I now live a horse & saddle worth twenty
pounds a Bed and furniture to each of them
fifthly it is my desire that all the money
I have by me with what is to collect.

be equally divided between my wife and my
four Daughters Judy Polly Melley and
Polly sixthly it is my desire that all
lands I claim the tract whereon I live
excepted when obtained shall be sold by my
Executor for cash and the money arising there-
from to be equally divided between four Daugh-
ters above mentioned also it is my desire at
my wifes death that all the stock in her
possession and house hold furniture be sold and
the money arising therefrom be equally divi-
