his house that is now building, also I
give to Peggy Evans the wife of Henry
Evans the following articles (to wit)
a Yellow grounded Calico Dress one blue
stuff Petticoat, one striped Cotton ditto

85 one pair thread stockings, and one
 Handkerchief. Also I give the balance of
 my wearing apparel to my much beloved
 friend Nancy. I give the wife of Levi
 Floyd; also I give to my niece Sarah
 Bedworth the daughter of Mary
 Bedworth deceased the balance of my
 money that is now remaining in
 Maj. Benjamin Lomax's hands in the
 State of Maryland and County of
 Somerset, and last of all I appoint
 Reuben Long of the County of Woodford
 and State of Kentucky to act as
 Executor of this my last will and
 Testament to settle my affairs and
 have every thing properly organized
 and to be paid for his trouble and
 services out of my Estate which
 will I ratify and confirm that
 no other to be my last will and
