By virtue and in pursuance of the
power of permission to me given by
a certain Indenture made previous
to my Marriage, myself and
Husband being parties to said
Indenture, I Frances Scott
do make this my last will and
Testament and publish the same
as such, hereby revoking any
former will; and by this

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Intending to dispossess of the slave
herein after mentioned being the same
which were in the said Indenture
mentioned, and their Increase -

It is my will and desire that my
Husband Gent. Ch^s Scott shall have
the use and loan of the following
Slaves called and named, Joe Scipio
Sarah & Ned during his natural
life. I give and bequeath unto
my daughter Polly Postlethwaite
her heirs forever these slaves
Robin, Sall & her child. Maria
Christian and her three children
Harry George and Matt. And my
fellow Joe, together with all the
Increase of said females to her during
which ^{have} and may happen after
the Marriage of my said daughter -
I give and bequeath unto my daughter
Martha J. Bibb and her heirs
forever these slaves, China, Fleming
Frederick and Edmund and all the
Increase from said woman China

81 which shall happen after my
said daughters Marriage - I give
and bequeath unto my daughter
Nancy Scott and her heirs forever
these Slaves, Scipio, to wit &c.
Ben. Jack Maria (or Miriam) Sarah
and Fanny together with all the
Increase of said females after
the first day of August in the
year 1804. I give and bequeath
unto the Children of my son
Charles Scott deceased. My Negro
Man King, to be hired out and
the hire to be applied to their
support until the youngest
comes of age or shall marry
whichever shall first happen and
then the said slave to be sold and
the proceeds to be Equally divided
amongst the survivors or survivors
of them; I give and bequeath unto
my grand daughter Betsey Kuchent
& Judith S. Scott and their heirs
forever to each a Negro between
seven and Ten years of age of as
Equal value as possible out of;

82 I to be taken from among the ~~children~~
descendants of my Slaves. Nancy, Sylvia
(or Scell) and sell now in the possession
of Littleberry Mosby in the state of
Virginia; I give and bequeath unto
my daughters Polly Pottlethwait Martha
J. Bibb and Nancy Scott & their heirs
forever to be Equally divided, share &
share alike, and as Tenants in commo-
on, my Slaves Nancy, Sylvia (or
Scell) and sell at present supposed
to be in the possession of Littleberry
together with all their Increase since
the year seventeen hundred and eighty
(to me at this time unknown) as also
the money and proceeds of their hire
since that time. the two Negroes
herein before divided to my two grand
daughters excepted. And whereas the
Slaves lent to my Husband and
afterwards divided away. I do hereby
declare the subsequent Clauses are
not Intended to revoke the said loan
to my said Husband but the divisions
are to take the said Slaves subject
to the said use of them before given
to them

3 to them. Lastly my friends Charles
 Raile & George Brooke are hereby
 appointed Executors of this my last
 Will and Testament In Witness of
 the premises I have subscribed
 my name and affixed my seal
 on this Eleventh day of July in the
 year eighteen Hundred and four
