7th day of October 1806—

In the name of God Amen: I George Hancock
of the County of Woodford and State of
Kentucky being weak in body but of sound
mind and Memory knowing that it is
appointed for all men once to die do
make and ordain this my last
Will and Testament, that is to say

28 I leave I bequeath unto my beloved wife
Mary Francisco all that tract of
Land wherein I now live including
the Dwelling House and Houses garn-
provision furniture and Farming Men-
of every Disposition which I may possess
at my Decease also two Slaves named
Sam. and Celia also all my stock of
Horses Cattle Hogs and Cheaps during
her Natural life. I leave I give unto
my son Andrew Francisco the tract
of Land I now live on to him &
his heirs with all its appurtenances
forever after the decease of my wife on his
paying the Legacy hereafter mentioned
and also one Gray mare by the name
of Fanny hill and two Colts to him
and his heirs forever. I leave I bequeath
unto my sons John and George Francisco
a Certain tract of Land lying on
Bartons Creek in the State of Tenisee
Containing six Hundred and forty
three acres to be Equally Divided between
them and their heirs forever. I leave the
Houses and Lots which I now own in
the town of Versailles to be sold
and one half of the price thereof
to be paid unto my Daughters

29 Nancy Francisco. I leave I give unto my
three Grands Children Nancy O'Bannon
George O'Bannon and Peggy O'Bannon
each a Horse worth twenty pounds out
of the sale of said Houses and Lots

at which time I give unto my daughter
Nancy fifty pounds to be paid by my son
Andrew in property after the decease of
my wife at which time all my property
which has not been heretofore been
bequeathed to be sold and Equally divided
between all my Children now living
it is also my desire that my two
Slaves Saml and Celia may make
Choice which of my Children they
may live with and if the see proper
to purchase them. And lastly I
do appoint my son John Francisco
and my son in Law George Frazer
Executors of this my last will and
Testament revoking and Rescinding
all other wills made by me. In
Testimony whereof I have hereunto
set my hand and seal this 9th day
of March in the year of our Lord
1805.
