and his heirs and assigns forever All my estate  
real personal and mixed and of every kind  
and description whatsoever To have and to  
hold the same with its appurtenances to the  
use of him and his heirs forever upon the trusts  
and subject to the powers provisions and limi-  
tations hereinafter expressed. In the first  
place to the intent and purpose that my  
said Executor shall emancipate my negro  
man slave Hezekiah Black in reward of his  
attentive and obedient conduct and faithful  
services to me - and in order to secure the  
freedom and emancipation of the said

313 Hezekiah Black I most earnestly request  
and desire my said Executor so to manage  
and dispose of the estate devised and bequeathed  
to him that my creditors may have their just  
demands paid and satisfied without selling  
or continuing in slavery the said Hezekiah  
Black to effect which I hereby authorize im-  
power and require my said executor to sell and  
convey all or any part or parcel of the lands of  
which I am possessed or to which I have any  
title claim or interest in law or equity upon  
such Terms and for such prices as he may  
deem expedient. I give and bequeath to the  
said Hezekiah Black all and singular my  
wearing apparel together with all the stock  
furniture and farming utensils with which  
I furnished him when he went to Frankfort  
Secondly to the intent and purpose that my  
said Executor shall emancipate my negro  
woman slave Letty and give to her such  
articles of Kitchen furniture of which I am  
possessed as he may think proper Sarah  
Thirdly I give and bequeath to Mrs. Sneed  
the wife of my friend Achilles Sneed &  
to her heirs forever my silver <sup>plate</sup> and  
eight <sup>silver</sup> ~~other~~ <sup>pieces</sup> ~~pieces~~ <sup>which</sup> are now in my  
possession.

Fourthly Intoken of my great esteem and respect for John Allen Esq Attorney at Law I give and bequeath to him my Gold Watch  
 Fifthly To my friend and physician Doct: John Roberts who has attended and prescribed for me without fee or reward I request and desire my Executors to present a full suit of Black

All the rest of and residue of my estate I give devise and bequeath to my said Executor Thomas Todd and his heirs forever

The Verbal declaration of John Selan  
decedent of Woodford County Kentucky rela-  
tive to the division of his real and  
personal estates among his children a little  
while before his death To wit I wish all  
my said debts to be paid. Then I give unto  
my beloved wife Mary the whole and sole  
use and benefit of my tract of land adjoining  
the lands of Robert Tait and others  
containing one hundred and twenty acres  
with all the appurtenances therunto belonging  
during her natural life also I give unto  
my said wife all the household and  
kitchen furniture now in my possession  
for her use and benefit during her natu-  
ral life and after her decease it is my  
wish that said household & kitchen fur-  
niture be equally divided between all my  
children (hereafter named) Also I give unto  
my said wife the whole and entire use  
of one room and fire place below stairs  
in my new house on the Tom Ford  
tract during her lifetime. I give unto  
my son Joseph a tract of land on which  
he now lives containing one hundred  
acres as by bond assigned unto him  
I give unto my said wife Mary and my  
son Thomas the use and benefit of my  
living stock of every kind during my said  
wife's natural life, then to be equally  
divided between among all my children

382 I give unto my son Thomas my Tract  
of land at the Tan yard with all the  
appurtenances therunto belonging together  
with my stock of hides bark and tools  
pertaining to the Tanning business I give  
unto my four Daughters namely Han-  
nah Talbot Eleanor Kennedy Mary Town-  
dole and Ann Bohannon one hundred  
dollar each to be paid unto them or their  
heirs by my son Thomas out of the  
legacy left him I give unto my grand  
Daughter Mary Martin a half share  
with my four daughters (above named)  
I give unto my son in law Joseph  
Martin father to my aforesaid Mary Mar-  
tin one dollar. Further more it is my  
wish and desire that my said Tract of  
land adjoining of Robert Talbot and  
others after the death of my wife shall  
be sold and equally divided among  
all my children and also my one land  
which may hereafter be recovered togeth-  
er with all monies due shall be equally  
divided among my children. This the above

entered into bond with Sarah Elkin and Joseph  
Woods their securities in the penalty of three
