the 6th day of July 1807-

In the name of God amen I Harris
Hicks of the County of Woodford and
State of Kentucky being weak in body
the sound in memory, and calling to
mind the certainty of death and
uncertainty of life and having a
few worldly to bestow at my death
do constitute this my last will and
Testament in form and manner
following, And first I will that all
my just debts with funeral charges
should be paid. I then I will that
my wife Caly Hicks enjoy the tract
of Land wherein I now live unmoles-
ted during her natural life but that
at her death said Land with its
appurtenances be Equally divided into
^{two equal shares}
and that one of the shares be at her
disposal as she may appoint forever
I then I will that all the other part of
my estate be divided into two Equal
Shares and that my wife Caly be
proprietor of one share to be disposed as
she may appoint forever

43 Item I will that the other share together
with the Land share be Equally divided
among my three brothers Thomas John
Hicks, William Hicks, and Moses Hicks to have
their Shares forever

and lastly I appoint my very good friend
William Hicks my brother and Caly Hicks
my beloved wife to be the sole Executors
of this my last will and Testament.

In the name of God amen; I John Watkins
of the County of Woodford County do make
and ordain this ^{to be} my last will and Testa-
ment in manner and form following
I send unto my wife Mary Watkins
during her life or Widow hood Ten Negroes
viz Phill, Dorris, Sinney, Hannah, Betty
Sue Nancy, Mary, Caroline and
Moses. The third part of the Land
whereon I now live and also as much
of my stock of Horses Cattle sheep
& Hogs & as much of my House hold
and Kitchen furniture and plantation
utensils as my Executors may Judge necessary
for her use and support also her riding
Chair and my Wagon and the goods
belonging thereto. I give unto my
Son John a little Negro girl called
Picks forty five pounds in Cash and

45 my watch which I wish him to keep and
give it to his little son when he gets old
enough to wear one

I send unto my son Samuel ~~two~~ ^{three} Negroes
Cutbert and Phillis as long as he lives and
after his decease Cutbert is to be a freeman
and Phillis with her Increase to be equally
divided among his Children Lawfully
begotten if any if none survive again
to my Estate I likewise give unto my
said Son two young Horses the oldest
and the youngest of his old Mares
Colts four head of Cattle a few sheep
and Hogs and my Bed and Bookcase
I give unto my daughter Polly Mosley a
Horse bridle and saddle and fifteen
pounds in Cash or Merchandise out of
some store as they may Choose and to
her two daughters Sally and Aris I give
Sinney two youngest Children called
Harriet and Johannah,
I give unto my daughter Phebe Mops
five Negroes, Ransdolph, Nanny, Bashee
Goodfrey, & Louency my black mare and
Cult two Cows and calves two or three
