Agreeable to an order of the Woodford County Court at their November Term to us directed after being duly sworn proceeded to divide the estate of James Bowdrey D. and allot the widow her dower in the following manner to wit, we find the negroes belonging to the estate to be worth £765 The one portion of which is £335 we allot to the widow the following negroes to wit, Sepia Mary Kito & Chaney amounting to £335 & given by pounds to be paid by the Legatee to Caspary Bowdrey the following negroes to wit, Simon, Judy, George & Isaac

182 amounting to £370 & to pay to the widow fifteen pounds & £34-15 in bonds for property sold at the sale.

To Samuel Bowdary the following negroes, Fowit, Anthony Cully Morris & abraham amounting to £2008 to pay the widow five pounds and £54 11¹/₂ in bonds for property sold at the sale & £73.18 a credit to the widow for property purchased by her at the sale the widow to execute her bond to Cassandra Bowdary for £24.12.4 & to Samuel Bowdary for £44 5¹/₂ given under our hands & seals this 30th of December 1808.

To my daughter Peggy I give one dollar. What remains of my personal estate after my just debts are paid I give my two daughters Becky & Maria
