of stock as are now named to them viz horses cows
sheep & hogs in full to their heirs or assigns forever
It is my will that Michael Dickey his heirs or assigns
shall have and hold two hundred acres of land forever
including his now improvements on the west of
my present improvements. 5 Then it is my will
that John Dickey my son his heirs or assigns shall
have and hold forever the remainder of my now
survey containing two hundred and twenty acres
including my improvements. 6 It is my will
that my son James Dickey his heirs or assigns
forever shall have and hold three hundred acres
of land taken out of my survey of fifteen hundred
acres lying between main Licking and the North
fork of Licking in the County of Mason The
balance to be equally divided between my sons

Michael James & John Dickey But in case
~~the above fifteen hundred acres~~ should not in
 point of title not be made good to my heirs
 administrators or assigns or to the amount of three

Kitchen furniture together with my stock and farming utensils for her use and benefit and for the benefit of my children and as my children arrive at full age or marriage ^{to} be furnished with such part thereof as she may conveniently spare in her discretion. Item it is my will that my executor, hereafter appointed shall deliver to each of my children their several legacies herein named at the time of their becoming of full age or marriage. Item I ^{as hereby} ~~do hereby~~ nominate and appoint my Beloved wife Juliana and my son Joseph E. Rucker & John S. Rucker my executor and executors, to this my last will and Testament who is hereby charged with the Execution of this my last will and testament hereby revoking all others.
