In the name of God Amen
I James Garnett of the County of Woodford do make and ordain this writing to be my last Will & Testament revoking all other Will or Wills by me heretofore made
1st I lend unto my beloved Wife Ann Garnett my Land and plantation whereon I now live together with all my negroes and Stock of every Kind with my plantation Utensils & Household and Kitchen furniture; so long as she shall live or remain my widow, and if she marries to have only one third part of my estate And then the remaining two thirds of my Negroes to be equally divided amongst my Sons-in-law, William Garnett & Eljah Bartraige and a my children Lewis, Thomas, James Anderson & Fanny Garnett: Otherwise the whole of my Negroes to be divided as aforesaid.
2nd At the death or marriage of my wife, I give & bequeath unto my son Anthony Garnett my Tract of land whereon I live, and my half the same fully
3^{rdly} I give unto my Daughter Fanny Garnett one Horse and saddle of the value of Eighty dollars.
4th Out of the balance of my personal Estate I give unto my sons James & Anderson One hundred dollars each, and the residue to be equally divided among all my children Except my son - Anthony.
5^{thly} If any just debts shall come against

my estate my Will and desire is for all
my children to bear an equal proportion,
excepting my son Anthony
7th And lastly I do hereby appoint my lo-
ving Wife Executrix & my sons Lewis & Thomas
Garnett Executors of this my last Will
and Testament, In Testimony Whereof I
have hereunto set my hand and seal this
the thirtieth day of October 1807
