daughter Nancy. To my two grand daugh-
ters Abigail and Nancy Humble I give
54 acres being the remainder of one hun-
dred and ten acres owned by me in the
tract on which Robert Humble is now
resident and moreover I give to my said
grand daughters Abigail Humble and
Nancy the profits earning from the
sale of my household furniture to be
equally divided between them This
amounts to all the property owned by
me and I have here disposed of it
agreeable to my will and intention
If any dispute should hereafter arise
from any discontented persons we held
premises there will not I leave it as my wish
that it may be referred to arbitrators chosen
by the mutual consent of both parties ac-
cording to law. This I acknowledge as my
true will and testament made this 14th

memory do wish and desire to dispose of what
little goods and Effects the Lord has been
pleased to bless me with in this life in

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manner and form following to wit; It
is my desire first of all that my just
debts should be paid. Then I give unto
my daughter Lucy Lambkin a negro
Girl named Jenny now in her possession
also I give unto my said daughter Lucy one
horse saddle and bridle valued at fifty dollars
again I give unto my two sons Robert & Jesse
one horse saddle and bridle each valued
at fifty dollars each to be rec^d when they
come of age again I give unto my daughters
Ann Judith & Elizabeth one horse saddle
and bridle each valued at fifty dollars each
to be received when ^{they} come of age again I
give unto my sons William Thomas John
and Zachariah one horse saddle and bridle
each valued at fifty dollars each to be
received when they come of age. Then
the residue or balance of my estate both
real and personal I give and bequeath unto
my beloved wife Susanna to do with as
she thinks proper during her natural life
and after her decease it is my wish and
desire that the whole of my estate then in
her possession be equally divided among
all my children hereinafter mentioned. This
