at their last Term appointing and directing us
as commissioners to appraise the slaves and
other personal Estate of John Lee deceased
and allot to John Crittenden who has
intermarried with Sarah Lee one of the heirs
of the said decedent the portion of said
Estate devised to her by the said decedent,
We and to make report to the next court
We Andrew Hamilton James Coleman and
George Bartlett three of the said commissioners
Report as followeth Viz. That we met at
the house of Elizabeth Lee widow of the said
John Lee deceased on the above date and
appraised the slaves and other personal prop-
erty belonging to the said Estate which was produced
to us by the said Elizabeth Lee his executrix
and Chas. Wallace one of his executors the
being first duly sworn proceeded to divide the
said slaves and other personal property into
six equal lots as nearly as circumstances would
permit. The slaves 30 in number were valued
at 8333 Dollars 96c 2/3 only the household
15 ~~ffter~~ in number were valued to 575 dollars

366 and 66²/₃ cents. The humped cattle 17 in number, we valued to 136 dollars & 13 cents. The Hogs 28 in number we valued to 42 dollars.

Then the said Sarah O. Britton drew by lot, the six slaves Charity Miller, Dennis (Miller's child), John Army (Cater's child), and Nelly Nelly's child. The amount of their value 1166 dollars and 33¹/₃ cents. And three horses, hind a brown horse, 3 years old a grey mare 7 years old and bay mare with the amount of their value 98 dollars 33¹/₃ cents, and three humped cattle a black speckled cow a red spotted cow and a young calf the amount of their valuation 21 dollars and 7 cents worth of Hogs, all which fall short of the owners part of the appraisement of the said negroes and property thirty three dollars.
