And three horses, hind, a brown horse, 3 years old, a grey mare 7 years old, and bay mare with the amount of their value 98 dollars 33<sup>1</sup>/<sub>3</sub> cents, and three humped cattle, a black speckled cow, a red spotted cow, and a young calf the amount of their valuation 21 dollars and 7 cents, worth of Hogs, all which fall short of the owners part of the appraisement of the said negroes and property thirty three dollars.

We William Steele John Edwards and Annan Bowman in obedience to an order of the County Court for the County of Woodford met at the house of Mrs. Nancy Blanton widow and administratrix of John Blanton deceased on Monday the 30<sup>th</sup> day of December 1811 and settled with the said Mrs. Blanton her account of her said administration allotted, and laid off her Dower in the tract of land where she lives, also of the slaves of the estate of the said deceased and divided the remainder of the said slaves amongst the children of the said deceased which we done agreeably to the statements following (to wit) we laid off to the said widow as her dower forty five acres out of the tract of 115 acres of land whereon she lives.

the quality of the whole tract being equal to the said 45 acres with about its proportion of woodland including all the buildings on the said tract they being situated near together and excludes the orchard and which said 45 acres in our opinion is equal in the value of its occupancy to one equal third of the whole tract and appurtenances, The said forty five acres is bounded as follows (to wit) Beginning at three inches corner to Thomas Bell thence North 66 west

Thompson Blanton rendered to us the account of advancement herewith filed marked "H" and Benjamin Blanton rendered the account herewith filed marked "I". The said Thompson & Benjamin shewed us the slaves which they had received of the said deceased which we appraised as follows to wit

We then gave to the said Thompson (by his consent) "Jenny" at 250 in addition to his said Negro man George at 333.33

371 which leaves due to the said Thompson Blanton for deficiency of his share of the slaves \$173.33 1/3

We gave to the said Benjamin Blanton (by his consent) negro girl Dookya \$250 in addition to his said negro man Isaac 400.00

which leaves due him for the deficiency in said slaves

The two above allotments were counted to by Richard Blanton (of age) & by the Guardians of all the infant heirs. The remaining 19 Slaves we divided into five parts apportionally as we could and the remaining six distributaries being all present also the Guardians of such as are infants being also present (being Elizabeth Blanton & James Blanton Infants) and their Guardian Richard Taylor Horace Blanton Nancy Blanton and Dorothy Blanton infants & their Guardian Benjamin Blanton. and Richard Blanton which six dividends we divided by lot and the lots drawn by each are as follows (to wit)
