I John Guin of Woodford County and State
 of Kentucky do make this my last will and
 manner and form following Viz. after my
 just Debts and final Expenses are paid
 I Leave to my brother Johnston Guin the tract
 of land whereon I now live in Woodford
 County for his benefit until his son Randal
 Guin arrives to the age of twenty one
 years at which time I give the aforesaid
 tract of land to the above mentioned
 Randal Guin son of Johnston Guin
 to him and his heirs forever I also give
 to my brother Johnston Guin for his
 benefit all my plantation Mills,
 House and Kitchen furniture the one
 half of my wearing apparel except
 my best hat, and also the one half
 of my books except my large House
 bible —

69 I give to Ann it over to one Cow and Calf or cow with Calf for the benefit of her and her heirs —

I give to my brother James Quinn my large Horse Bible and my best hat and one half of the balance of my wearing apparel and books —

I give to my nephews, William and John Quinn sons of Hugh Quinn five pounds in Cash, to be paid by my Executors to them or their father for their use —

I give to my Mother Jane Quinn and my sister Jane Quinn my negro woman Rose for their use jointly, so long as they both live and at the decease of either the survivor shall have the benefit of said negro until her death at which time my Will is that Rose the above mentioned negro and her children if any shall be set free by them —

I also give to my sister Jane Quinn my Brown Horse on Conditions she shall never Dispose of him

70 until they are parted by Death —
I give to my friend Joseph Dickman Ten Dollars —

My Will further is that my Executor shall sell the balance of my stock of Horses, in order to pay my just Debts and the legacies that Demand money within mentioned provided However the money arising from the sale of the Horses should not be sufficient to make the payments as above my Executor shall sell so much of my other stock as shall be sufficient — and the balance of my stock of Cows, Hogs, and sheep together with my part of the crop the fruit and present stock of provisions I give to my brother John ten Quinn after paying my just Debts and Legacies, and collecting the money due my Estate if there should be a balance of money in the hands of my Executor my Will is that he shall pay to my brother James Quinn for the use of his son John Quinn five pounds

71. And I do last of all appoint Charles
Railey my Executor of this my last
Will, and desire he may pay
himself fifteen dollars out of my
Estate in addition to what the
Court may allow him for his
Trouble; Witness my hand and
Seal this 24th day of September
1807.
