Be it remembered that I Robert Marsh
-am of the County of Washington and
State of Virginia being in a low state of
health but of sound mind and memory
do constitute this my last will and
Testament in manner and form follow-
ing that is to say after all my
just debt and funeral expenses be paid
I desire the residue may be divided as
follows. First I leave the whole of my
Estate in the hands of my beloved
wife Jane Marsham for the maintenance
of herself and child or children as she
can may be and put it out on interest
or such part as she may think proper
Secondly at the time my child or
children should become of age I desire
that my property may be equally divided
among my wife and child or

children as may be and in case any
them should die before that time I desire
the survivor or survivors may enjoy the
whole I do hereby constitute and appoint
my beloved wife Jane Marsham Executor
of this my last will and testament here-
revoking all other or former wills or testam-
by me heretofore made In witness whereof
I have hereunto set my hand and affixed
my seal this seventh day of October one
thousand eight hundred and eleven

Virginia Court At a Court held for Wash-
ington County the 26th day of November 1811
This last Will and Testament of Robert
Marsham deceased was produced in Court
proven by the oaths of Jonathan Smyth John
Grills and Rebecca Reagan the subscribing
witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded
and at a Court held for the said County
the 19th day of May 1812 on the motion
of Jane Marsham the executrix therein
named who took the oath of an executrix
prescribed by law and entered into and
acknowledged the bond with Nicholas

Reagan security in the sum of three thousand Dollars conditioned as the law directs a certificate is therefore granted her for the probate of the said will in due form.

I Charles Binns of the County of Loudoun and Commonwealth of Virginia clerk being at this time of sound and perfect memory as hereby make this my last will and Testament for the disposal of my Estate after my decease: I Give I give to my beloved wife Ann Binns my clock to her by her disposed of as she shall think proper by will or otherwise & I also give unto my said wife the use of all my Estate both real and personal to be by her possessed during her natural life and after her death I give as follows having give unto my sons John Alexander Binns Charles Binns and Thomas ~~Binns~~ Nelson Binns, by Deeds two hundred & twenty acres of land each it is to be considered as their part of my land held in this County. 2nd I give to my son Simon Alexander Binns one Hundred acres of land to be laid off adjoining the one hundred and twenty acres I have already given him and whereon he now lives to him and his heirs and assigns forever. 3rd I give to my son William Alexander Binns the remainder of my lands in this County being at least two hundred and twenty acres (excepting thereout one half acre where the ground
