I William Williams of Woodford County and State of Kentucky being very weak in body, but of sound mind and memory, the Lord be Praised for it. but Calling to mind the Mortality of my body. and that it is appointed for man once to die. Do make and ordain this my last will and Testament in the following manner. First I Recommend my soul into the hands of almighty God that Gave it, hoping to obtain pardon, and Remission of my sins thro. the merits of my redeemer Jesus Christ. and my body I Recommend to the earth to be entered in a Christian Burial after the discretion of my Executors hereafter named: nothing doubting but at the General resurrection I shall rise again by the mighty power of God: and as touching such worldly Estate as God

heirs forever and I do hereby exonerate and
appoint Bala Cropper and William
Whittington Executors of this my last Will
and Testament hereby ratifying and
Confirming this my last Will and Testament
In Witness and Testimony whereof I
have hereunto set my hand and seal this
10th day of August 1802.

At a Court held for Woodford County the
1st day of October 1802

This the last Will and Testa-
ment of Samuel Adair deceased was
produced in Court and proven by the
oaths of Mary Cropper, Rhoda Cropper
and John Cropper witnesses thereto and
ordered to be recorded. On motion of
William Whittington and Bala Cropper
the Executors therein named, who Executed
and Acknowledged Bond as the Law
directs Certificate is granted them for
obtaining a probate thereof in due
form.
