Powers I do appoint and constitute this my last
will and testament in the manner and form
following viz, 1 I do commit my body to the dust
and my soul to almighty God who gave it. 2. after
my funeral and other lawful debts are discharged
it is my will. 3 That my sons Michael James
and John Dickey shall have and hold such part
of stock as are now named to them viz horses cows
sheep & hogs in full to their heirs or assigns forever
It is my will that Michael Dickey his heirs or assigns
shall have and hold two hundred acres of land forever
including his now improvements on the west of
my present improvements. 5 Then it is my will
that John Dickey my son his heirs or assigns shall
have and hold forever the remainder of my now
survey containing two hundred and twenty acres
including my improvements. 6 It is my will
that my son James Dickey his heirs or assigns
forever shall have and hold three hundred acres
of land taken out of my survey of fifteen hundred
acres lying between main Licking and the North
fork of Licking in the County of Mason The
balance to be equally divided between my sons
