little goods and Effects the Lord has been
pleased to bless me with in this life in

is my desire first of all that my just
debts should be paid. Then I give unto
my daughter Lucy Lambkin a negro
Girl named Jenny now in her possession
also I give unto my said daughter Lucy one
horse saddle and bridle valued at fifty dollars
again I give unto my two sons Robert & Jesse
one horse saddle and bridle each valued
at fifty dollars each to be rec^d when they
come of age again I give unto my daughters
Ann Judith & Elizabeth one horse saddle
and bridle each valued at fifty dollars each
to be received when ^{they} come of age again I
give unto my sons William Thomas John
and Zachariah one horse saddle and bridle
each valued at fifty dollars each to be
received when they come of age. Then
the residue or balance of my estate both
real and personal I give and bequeath unto
my beloved wife Susanna to do with as
she thinks proper during her natural life
and after her decease it is my wish and
desire that the whole of my estate then in
her possession be equally divided among
all my children herebefore mentioned. It is

my wish that the property I give unto my
 Children under age above shall remain in
 the hands of my wife till they come of age
 also it is my wish that the said negro
 girl named Jenny above which I give
 unto my daughter Lucy Lambkin be
 valued now and she hold the same until
 an equal division of my Estate is made
 after the death of ^{my} wife and said value
 deducted out of her part thereof and
 finally it is my wish and desire and I
 appoint John B Lambkin Robert and Jesse
 Poor my two sons as Executors with my be-
