In the Name of God amen. I William Williams of Woodford County and State of Kentucky being very weak in body, but of sound mind and memory, the Lord be Praised for it. but Calling to mind the Mortality of my body. and that it is appointed for man once to die. Do make and ordain this my last will and Testament in the following manner. First I Recommend my soul into the hands of almighty God that Gave it, hoping to obtain pardon, and Remission of my sins thro. the merits of my redeemer Jesus Christ. and my body I Recommend to the earth to be entered in a Christian Burial after the discretion of my Executors hereafter named: nothing doubting but at the General resurrection I shall rise again by the mighty power of God: and as touching such worldly Estate as God

as God hath been pleased to bestow
upon me I give demise and dispose of
in the following manner.

Imprimis my desire is that my
just Debts and funeral Expenses
be first paid and discharged.

Item my Will is that my well beloved
wife Keriah Williams shall have her
Chest and her wearing Clothes and
side Saddle Exclusive of any division
here after mentioned. and if Keriah
should survive my decease I will
that there shall be an Equal division
made of all my lands and properties
and money between my said wife
Keriah Williams and my four sons John
Williams, Wm and William, Ezra Williams,
Zeephaniah Williams, and further my
Will is that the lands and properties be
all Exposed to publick sale, that a
division of my Estate may be made
Equally.

Item my Will is that, if my beloved
wife Keriah Williams should decease
before this my Will and Testament
should be proved and Recorded then
the whole to be divided Equally between my
four sons named above but if she
the said Keriah Williams should

survive the Recording of this my Will
and Testament she takes her Equal
division to use and dispose of at her own
pleasure.

Item my Will is that my wife Keriah
Williams shall have her bed and furniture
Exclusive of the division above mentioned.
Item I likewise Constitute that my wife
Keriah Williams and John Butler and
George Butler his son be Executors of this
my last Will and Testament. revoking
and annulling all other former Wills
and Testaments by me before made
Ratifying and Confirming this and no other
In Witness whereof I have hereunto set
my hand and seal this eighth day
of October 1798. Being sealed signed pronounced
and declared to be the last Will and Testament
of William Williams in presence of us
Alexander Buckham William Williams
Thomas, McCarty
Josiah Elam

Having sometime past made my Will
and left it in writing, but now recollect-
ing the affairs of my Children inter this
as a Cordial to my Will Item I
Will that my oldest son George Williams
be bound to learn the trade of shoe and

Root making with some money of
Credit in his trade, I send to wit that
my second son William Williams be
bound to the Silver Smiths trade where
he may have the opportunity of getting
the trade in full. I will that my
third Ezra Williams and fourth son
Zephaniah Williams be bound together
to the Saddlers trade where there may
be a probability of the obtaining
that trade in full. Signed and sealed
this Eleventh day of July 1804
