Pursuant to an order of the honorable County Court of Woodford bearing date April Term 1813 me the undersigned commissioners met on the 7<sup>th</sup> day of April 1813 the whole of the heirs and Representatives of Wankerson Read deceased being present presented an account of the different advances made them and have valued the Slaves and allotted them as follows the following statement viz

Now to make the advances of £ 346.50 to Thomson Read there was allotted to him by us a negro boy Tony & 1 bed and furniture and to make the advance to Luey Read of £ 573 me allotted to her three negroes Polly Moriah and Hetta and one bed and furniture me then proceeded to ascertain the amount of sales to wit £ 470.39 1/2 after deducting £ 200 for the probable amount of debts and expenses there remained £ 270.33 1/2 making a dividend of £ 27.03 Then settling each Represen-
