In the name of God amen I Caleb Wallace of the county of Woodford and State of Kentucky being at present in a declining state of health but enjoying a sound mind and memory do make this my last will and testament. In the first place I commend my soul to the mercy of God through the merits and mediation of our Lord Jesus Christ the only and all sufficient <sup>and</sup> sinner, and my body to the grave to be buried in a decent and frugal manner in the hopes of its joyful resurrection. and as to the estate of which I am possessed in this world I dispose of it as followeth to wit:  
I will that my debts and funeral expenses shall first be paid and for these purposes and for the support and education of my son Christian Wallace until he arrives to the age of twenty one years. I hereby request and empower my executors herein after named or a majority of those of them who shall qualify and in. continue alive to dispose of at private sale about four hundred and sixty six acres of land lying on the waters of Lost creek and trace water

River and Union County it being two tenth parts of his survey made in the name of Edmund Taylor who dec<sup>d</sup> which I have purchased from several of the said Taylors children and their assigns; and the five hundred acre tract of land on brush creek in the state of Ohio granted to me as assignee of Robert Rogers by the United States of America also my negroes named Rachel and her child Lucretia also Violet and Adam together with the children that may be hereafter born of the said Rachel and Violet and to make deed of conveyance and bills of sale to the purchasers with general warranty and it is my particular desire that the said negroes should be sold to good masters

Having provided for my beloved wife Mary by Coverture and marriage contract nearly as amply as my circumstances will permit I only give and devise to her a good suit of morning clothes her watch and the books she brought with her and claims as her own: also so long as she shall continue my widow and keep my Family together as herein after mentioned the use of my negro woman called old Kate and her future increase and should there be any legal defect in the said Coverture and marriage Contract (dated the 12<sup>th</sup> day of June 1800 and recorded in the office of the clerk of the court of appeals) I notwithstanding will & direct that the same shall be completed with as fully as if the whole of it were inserted in this my last will and testament Provided however my said wife shall not claim any other or further part of my estate real or personal but what is herein devised to her. Having heretofore given to my son Samuel Wallace a reasonable proportion of my estate I only give and devise to him one hundred dollars each if he personally applies for it

It is however to be understood that I have given to him and his heirs forever the negroes John and Jonathan now in his possession. I give and bequeath to my son in law William Logan and to my Daughter Priscilla Christian Logan his wife and to their heirs forever one thousand and sixty seven acres of land lying on Sun Camp creek in Harison County it being a tract devised to me by my Father Samuel Wallage deceased and the amount of the decree for five thousand dollars and costs of suit which I have obtained against the executors and heirs of Thomas Madison deceased in the General Court for the State of Kentucky. also one hundred dollars each and my negro boy named Cincy also the negro named Linder also Kefe and her children now in the possession of the said William Logan and wife. I give and bequeath to my son John Wallace and his heirs forever one thousand acres of land lying in the county of Hopkins on Prager creek a branch of Trade water River and two hundred and sixty six and two thirds acres of land lying onuddy creek in Caldwell County both of which tracts of land have been conveyed to me by Willis Morgan my negro Daniel now in the possession of said John Wallace also my negro boy named Loughton and one hundred dollars should he personally apply for it I give and bequeath unto my son Henry Wallace and to his heirs forever that half of the tract of land on which I reside called Webb's place and the bend (the whole tract supposes to contain about eight hundred acres) the division to be made by Beginning at a corner of Thomas Ramsey's land opposite to his house on the bank of the south fork of Elkhorn creek and running thence such true and correct courses as will divide to the best advantage the said Webb's place and bend from

what is called my home place except it shall be found more advantageous to run through part of what is called my far Pasture which I believe will be found to suit best all my negroes named Cisha Williamson Preston Bobb Betty and her child Washington and her future increase together with my bay horse Vlack horse and young Brown mare which he claims as his own property and one hundred dollars cash I give and bequeath unto my son Christian Wallace and his heirs forever the other half of the said last mentioned tract of land called my home place and a part of which is subject to the life estate secured to my said wife Mary at her lifetime and my negroes named George his wife Kate and her children Alice and Dorie and Harrison also Abraham his wife Sally their Daughters Rhody and Sincy together with the future increase of the said Bull and Sally Jonathan the son of Rachel and one hundred dollars when the said Christian Wallace arrives to the age of 21 years.

I give and bequeath my son William Wallace and to his heirs forever (who I have omitted in the place pointed out by his age) all the land I claim by sundry purchases which I have made on Rough creek at the mouth of Barnetts creek in the county of ... this amounting to about two thousand three hundred acres and upwards being several parts of a survey of 2000 acres made in the name of Edmund Taylor since deceased also my negroes Isaac Eliza Russell Wife and her together with a chestnut horse mare having a bald face and her two colts which he claims as his property also one hundred dollars cash. It is my wish that my said wife Mary do take for the negroes I have secured to her by the said marriage contract my

negroes under and out but if she does not accept of them I will that both or either of them which she refuses shall go in the place of the negro or negroes which she may choose.

If any of the negroes which I have herein devised to my son Christian Wallace shall grossly misbehave before he arrives to the age of twenty one years I hereby empower the guardian or guardians of the said Christian to sell such negro or negroes for his benefit.

After my said wife Mary has received the Books herein devised to her I give that such part of the remainder of my Library as my Executors shall think proper shall be distributed between all my children; and also that my wearing apparel be divided amongst my children and negroes as my said Executors shall think proper. I further give and bequeath unto my son Henry Wallace one thousand acres of land surveyed in my name the second day of April 1785 & adjoining a survey made for Thomas Smith and a survey made for Walter Braym on the waters of Licking river or perhaps on some of the waters of the Ohio River to the eastward or north eastward of Licking and also my silver watch to him and to his heirs forever. I further will and direct that in addition to the negroes I have herein directed to be sold that my Executors do also sell my negroes woman Rose her child Cathor and her future increase. After my debts and funeral expenses are paid and a sufficient sum of money is reserved for the payment of my said wife annuity and the cash legacies herein devised and the other purposes herein directed I will that the proceeds of the said residue of all my estate both real and personal not herein particularly devised shall be equally divided between all my children now alive and their respective heirs. If my

 said wife Mary after my decease shall  
 choose to reside on the tract of land herein  
 devised to my son Christian Wallace (a part  
 of which she will have an estate during her  
 life) and to keep my son Christian Wallace  
 with her and any of my other sons I hereby  
 authorize my Executors at their discretion  
 to make with her any contract relative thereto  
 which they shall judge to be expedient and to  
 keep on the said Plantation any of the negroes  
 belonging to such child or children and such  
 so many of my live stock Plantation tools  
 and household and Kitchen furniture as they  
 shall judge expedient and also to employ an  
 overseer to superintend the same. But if my  
 said wife shall not choose to reside on the  
 said plantation I hereby authorize and empower  
 or my said Executors if they judge it expedient  
 to take a lease from her on behalf of my  
 said son Christian Wallace for her lifetime  
 part of the same and to pay the rent therefore  
 out of the proceeds thereof or if my said son  
 Henry Wallace should wish to sell the part  
 of the land herein devised to him before my  
 said son Christian Wallace attains to the  
 age of twenty one years I hereby authorize  
 and empower the guardian or guardians of  
 the said Christian with the consent of my said  
 wife Mary if she be alive to sell his said  
 land called my home place and to make deed  
 of conveyance to the purchaser or purchasers  
 with general warranty and after paying my  
 said wife what they shall adjudged reasonable  
 for relinquishing her lifetime to a part thereof  
 then at his or their discretion to lay out the  
 balance of the money for the benefit of the  
 said Christian \* or as my will that my  
 executors do distribute amongst such of my

A Codicil to the foregoing last will & Testa-  
 ment of Caleb Wallace dated the twenty eight  
 day of last January. This Codicil he now annu-  
 ces thereto and declares and publishes it to be  
 an addition to the same and part thereof.  
 Whereas the said Caleb Wallace by the mar-  
 riage contract therein referred to which contract  
 between the said Caleb Wallace and his wife  
 Mary hath secured to her in case she should  
 survive him, one of his negro girls or women  
 for the use and benefit of the said Mary and  
 her heirs and assigns forever also one of his ne-  
 gro boys for her use and benefit as long only  
 as she shall continue his widow and the said  
 Caleb in the preceding last will & Testament

hath named his negro girl Linder and his  
negro boy Vint to fulfil the said purposes.  
Now I the said Caleb Wallace do fur-  
ther provide that in case the said Mary  
shall die before the said Caleb he doth by  
himself give and bequeath the said Linder  
to his son Christian Wallace and his  
heirs forever. And he also further provides  
that after the said Mary shall marry  
or depart this life he doth hereby give  
and bequeath the said Vint to his son Wil-  
liam Wallace and his heirs forever. But  
should the Mary make choice of any other  
of my negroes than the said Linder & Vint  
it is my will that the said negro or negroes  
she may choose shall be subject to the dis-  
position of this Codicil so far as the law  
will permit. Provided however that if either  
of my negro-lads William or Aaron shall  
die before my said wife's right  
to the said negro Vint shall cease then it is  
my will that the said Vint shall go to my  
son and heirs to whom I have devised the  
land who may so die. or if either of my ne-  
gro girls Cinny or Betty Eliza or Rhody shall  
die before my said wife's right to the said  
negro Linder shall cease then it is my will  
that the said Linder shall go to my Daughter  
or son and their heirs to whom I have devised  
the good who may so die. And whereas  
I have empowered my friend Thomas L  
Hinson of the state of Ohio to sell my five  
hundred acres of land which lies on Brush  
Creek in the said state of Ohio: Now if  
the said Thomas L Hinson shall before or  
after my decease sell the same or any

part thereof I hereby empower him to make  
a deed or deeds of conveyance with general war-  
ranty to the purchaser or purchasers and their  
heirs and the same any one or more of my  
Executors are hereby empowered to do and I hereby  
further declare that this codicil and the fore-  
going last will and testament are wholly  
written with my own hand in witness whereof  
I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my  
deed this fifteenth day of February 1814

A second Codicil to the foregoing last will and  
Testament of Caleb Wallace which he now an-  
nounces thereto and declares and publishes it to

If it should be necessary to institute suit at  
law or in chancery for any part of my estate  
or if suits should be instituted to take away  
any part thereof it is my will and I hereby  
empower a majority of my executors who shall  
qualify as such to make any compromise they  
in thing shall think proper. And I further  
authorize the said majority of my executors  
to borrow money on liberal interest to pay pressing  
demands against my estate until each can be accom-  
plished by sales thereof and whereas I have  
largely raised by sales thereof and whereas I have  
entered into a contract with the agents of the ex-  
ecutors of Thomas Mason decd. to receive lands in  
discharge of the five thousand dollars and costs  
of suit for which I have lately obtained a decree  
in the general court for the state of Kentucky  
Now I hereby declare it to be my will that all  
the lands which may be so acquired shall go to  
my son in law William Logan and my Daughter

180 his wife Priscilla and their heirs forever in the same manner as it is provided in the foregoing last will and testament that she and her thousands dollars and costs shall go to them. I hereby declare that if before my death I should collect the \$2000 dollars & costs of suit or any part thereof for which I have lately obtained a decree against the heirs & executors of Thomas Madison dec'd to do or should take any lands or other property in payment for the same or any part thereof it is my will that my son in law W L and his wife P B and their heirs shall be entitled to all the lands property or money so received and taken or agreed to be taken in payment as aforesaid.

This the last will and testament of Caleb Wallace dec'd together with the first Codicil thereto annexed was produced in court and proven by the oaths of Andrew B Hamilton and James Hamilton subscribing witnesses thereto. and the second Codicil annexed thereto was also produced in court and proven to be written wholly in the hand writing of the said Caleb Wallace dec'd by the oaths of John McKinney Jr and Andrew Hamilton and all were ordered to record and John Hamilton William Logan Henry Wallace and William Wallace four of the executors named in said will came into court and took the oath required by law and executed bond with Andrew Hamilton Archibald Kincaid & William B Blackburn their securities in the penalty of \$12000 conditioned according to law and leave is reserved for the other Executors therein named to qualify

In the name of God amen I William Williams of the county of <sup>Woodford</sup> State of Kent being very sick and weak in body but of sound mind and memory and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make Ordain & constitute this to be my last will and testament that is to say principally and first of all I recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God and my body I recommend to the dust to be buried in decent Christian burial nothing doubting but that the general resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God and as touching my worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased almighty God to bless me with in this life I have devised and disposed of the same in the following manner & form that is to say. First I give unto my beloved wife Jane Williams all my estate both real and personal freely to be possessed & enjoyed by her during the term of her natural lifetime and widowhood with this proviso that each of my children as they arrive at the age of perfection it is my desire that my wife should send unto each of them as much of my personal estate as she can conveniently spare without distressing herself. But if she should marry my will and pleasure is that the whole of my estate should be equally divided between my wife and children and my grand Daughter Polly Etherington Daughter of Gilding Etherington and Betsey Etherington his wife die. But with this condition that out of the portion of my effects that shall fall to the

share of the said Polly Etherington a part shall be deducted out the same which shall be equivalent to the portion which I gave to my Daughter Betsey Etherington dec<sup>d</sup>. Mother of the said Polly Etherington. And if the said Polly Etherington should die before she arrives at the age of perfection the same shall be equally divided amongst my surviving children. Last of all I do appoint my wife Jane Williams and Henry Shoued sent to be the sole Executors of this my last will & testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 10<sup>th</sup> day of December 1812
