This day of April 1814 Thaddeus Wilson and John Long Junr took the oath as commissioners and are appointed to appraise the personal estate of Thaddeus Wilson deceased May 2nd 1814 Wm Amhurst

 The foregoing inventory and appraisement of the estate of Thaddeus Wilson deceased was produced in court and ordered to record Test John McKimney

Woodford County Set me the undersigned commissioner of in obedience to an order of the county court of said county made at their December term 1812 directing us to allot to Hannahs widow and relict of Eliha Woodbridge her dower in his personal estate and to divide the residue among his heirs and representatives reports as followeth That we met at the house of the widow on the 22nd day of December 1813 for the purpose aforesaid and we realized twelve slaves belonging to said said estate which was produced to us by the administrator to the sum appraised \$4000. 1st we allotted to the widow the following slaves as her dower to wit Caston a negro

man values at \$250 Hannah a negro woman
valued at \$300 and a negro man valued at \$400
and Betty a negro girl valued at \$200 all amount-
ing to \$1200 which sum falls short of the one
third part of the value of the slaves the sum
of \$450 we allotted to James Quarles (who
unmarried with Faller Woodbridge one of the
Daughters of the decedent) Esther a negro woman
and her female child same values at \$375 and
Orsburn a negro boy values at \$150 which S.
Quarles agreed to take as his full proportion
of the negroes we allotted to Nancy Young
the widow of John R Young deceased another
Daughter of the decedent, Minna a negro woman
values at \$375 which falls short of her pro-
portion \$165 4th we allotted to Robert Wood-
bridge a negro man named Cyrus values at
\$400 & Paylon a negro boy values at \$200
which exceeds his proportion \$160. 5th we
allotted to Egmont & Rucker (who hath in-
termarried with Caroline Woodbridge another
another Daughter of the decedent) Jerry a negro
man values at \$500 which falls short of
his proportion \$40 & 6th we allotted to
William Woodbridge a negro man Spencer
values at \$400 and Darcus a negro woman
values at \$200 which exceeds his propor-
tion \$160 and for the purpose of making
the division more equal among the widow
and heirs as to the slaves we do direct that
Robert Woodbridge pay to Hannah Woodbridge
the sum of \$140 and to Nancy Young \$20
and that William Woodbridge pay said
Nancy \$132 & to Egmont & Rucker \$85 given
under our hands the date above written
