Now to make the advances of £ 346.50 to Thomson Read there was allotted to him by us a negro boy Jony & 1 bed and furniture and to make the advance to Luey Read of £ 573 me allotted to her three negroes Polly Moriah and Hetta and one bed and furniture me then proceeded to ascertain the amount of sales to wit £ 470.39 1/2 after deducting £ 200 for the probable amount of debts and expenses there remained £ 270.33 1/2 making a dividend of £ 27.03 Then settling each Represen-
 tative proportion it appears that William Blodges is entitled to receive £ 32 " 4 Reuben Long £ 28 " 4

Pursuant to an act of the General Assembly
enacted an act for the benefit of the heirs of
Thomas Marshall and Joseph and Jane Hunter dec^d
approved January 4th 1813 we Charles Bailey
Benjamin Watkins and William Kerby have this
3rd day of May 1813 sold and executed a Deed
to Robert Seavey for the tract of land in the county
of Woodford the property of the heirs of Joseph
and Jane Hunter deceased containing one hundred
and eighty eight acres one rood and thirty three
poles (instead of one hundred and twenty as
mentioned in the above recited act) on the
following Terms to wit Two thousand dollars paid
in hand Seaveys bond executed for eight hundred
and eighty four dollars and fifty cents payable
on or before the first day of March 1814 one 00
executed for eight hundred and eighty four dollars
and fifty cents payable on or before the first day
of March 1815 making a sum of three thousand
