queath to my wife Maryann during her life
all other property as above mentioned to be sold
and collid by my Executors with power to collect and
for recover all sums of moneys due by debts or
shall become due by sale or sale of my Estate
I then give to my Niece Frances Nelson twenty
five dollars annually to be laid out in wearing
apparel for her to be taken out of the hire
of Mariah and Beverly I then give and

bequeath the balance of the hire of Mariah and Beverly to be equally divided between my wife Maryann and Elizabeth Cotton.

Item I desire after my Just debts is paid out of the moneys arising from debts due me or sales of my said Estate the balance to be divided in six parts Two parts to Elizabeth Cotton two parts to Eliza Bannan (alias) Bucham one part more to John O'Bannon Laurence one part unto John O'Bannon son of my brother Joseph the other part I desire after the decease of my wife Maryann all the property left to her for life with my Bullskin tracts on the Ohio in the state of Ohio Cleamont county my part of Lot No one with its improvements Mariah & Beverly to be sold to highest bidder and divided into eight parts one part to Elizabeth Cotton one part to Eliza Bannan (alias Bucham) one other part to Joseph Norvell Cotton one other part to Prusly N O'Bannon one other part to Anne and Margaret O'Bannon Daughters of my Brother William O'Bannon to be equally divided between them one other part to William O'Bannon and Mary Rennie son and Daughter of my brother Joseph O'Bannon to be equally divided between them one other part I give to Lucy and Fanny O'Bannon Daughters of my Brother Thomas O'Bannon to be equally divided between them. The last part I give to my wife's niece Maryann Bohannon daughter of W B O'Bannon to them and their heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath to my grand son John O'Bannon Cotton all that tract of land lying in this state in the County of Brackin heretofore included in my Bullskin tract at the decease of my wife Maryann to him and his heirs forever. Item it is my desire that none of the foregoing Servus. shall enter into full profession till they arrive at full age but those negroes left to my brother William children to be lent to them or hired out for their use till they come of age. Not having any legal aid in the writing this will I do request and appoint my trusty friends Robert Alexander Esq^r Doct. Lewis Marshall and Herman Bowman Esq^r to construe this my last will and ~~to~~ divide all controversies if any should arise without their referring to the law I do also appoint Robert Alexander Esq^r and George T Cotton my Executors of this my last will ~~given~~ given under my hand and seal this the seventeenth day of January 1810
