In Obedience to an order of the most honourable county
 court for Woodford county at their February Term
 1813 we the undersigned commissioners after being
 duly sworn proceeded to allot to Elizabeth Wicks
 widow and relict of William Wicks deceased her
 dower and make distribution of the said Estate among
 the legates as follows to wit To the widow her
 thirds of the real Estate Two hundred and two acres
 three quarters and twenty two poles of land and town-
 ed as follows to wit Beginning at a boxed high
 cry and bushy and running south 18 most 160 poles
 to a sugar tree and stone thence north 70 most 200
 to a hickory bushy and paupaw bush thence north
 18 east 160 poles to a stone in the line between
 Mr^s Wicks and Nathaniel Harris thence south
 70 East 200 poles to the Beginning also a small
 piece lying between said Beginning and the road
 leading from Frankfort to Lexington which makes
 a perpendicular of 14 poles and a base of 66 poles
 and the following slaves to wit Sam at \$500
 Doctor at \$430 Isaac at \$230 Jane at \$330
 Monah at \$300 Venus at \$200 George at \$230
 and Robin at \$165 " 66 $\frac{2}{3}$ cents amounting to two
 thousand four hundred and thirty two dollars sixty
 six and two thirds cents and \$1139 " 49 cents in
 money and debts due the Estate in the hand of the
 administrators we have also made distribution of the
 slaves and personal Estate between the legates agree-
 ble to said order as follows to wit To Philip M^r
 who married Polly Wicks the following slaves
 to wit Joe and Robin at \$650 and \$247 " 97 $\frac{1}{2}$
 in bond in the hands of the administrators.
