a negro girl named Franky to her & her heirs forever
I then give to my Daughter Sally two negro boys
named Roderick and Lewis a bed and furniture a

 forever. I give to my Daughter Nancy a negro
 woman named Betty and negro boy named Ed-
 mund his and furniture a second horse with
 a blaze face saddle and bridle I give to
 to my Daughter Polly one cow & I give
 a bed & furniture I give to my grandson
 John a bed and furniture and if he should
 happen to die unmarried or without a lawful heir
 then my will is that my Grand Daughter Eliza-
 beth Lion have the above bed and furniture I give
 his my will and desire that at the death of my
 wife she have he sets the money divided between
 Elizabeth Sally & Nancy and when that event takes
 place my will is Elizabeth Sally & Nancy pay
 to my Daughter Polly children the
 the sum of one hundred and sixty six dollars
