I John H. Woolfolk of Woodford County State
 of Kentucky being of sound mind and memory
 do make and ordain this to be my last will and
 testament. provided I should never return from my
 contemplated expedition to Canada - I give & bequeath
 to Samuel Lord of Pendleton County and State afore-
 said all that tract or parcels of land lying & being
 in the County of ~~Woodford~~ Franklin on the waters
 of Elkhorn containing about four hundred acres
 together with the mill distillery and Tavern (called
 Brooks Tavern) with all and singular the appur-
 tenances thereunto belonging I also give and be-
 queath unto the said Samuel Lord and undivided
 moiety of twenty eight hundred acres of land
 lying and being in the Counties of Boone

Pendleton and Gallatin on the waters of the Ohio with
 all and singular the appurtenances thereunto belonging
 as and among the above tract of land was entered
 surveyed and patented in the name of Joseph Kelly and
 I wish it understood that I only give to the said
 Samuel Lord my right & the and interests therein in the
 said land he abiding by the laws if any of the same
 I also give and bequeath unto the said Samuel Lord
 three negroes which he has now in his possession
 to wit Anthony Ford and Elary and three more and former
 I also give and bequeath unto my brother Thomas
 Woolfolk a tract of land in the County of Henry
 on the waters of Green river containing twelve hun-
 dred and fifty acres and one negro man named Gabriel
 one negro boy named Silas and a negro girl named
 Pricilla together with a negro boy named Fulkling
 I give and bequeath unto George Woolfolk Jun^r
 a negro man named Bobb and negro woman named
 Hester a negro girl named Maria and two hundred
 acres of land in the County of Scott on the waters
 of Elkhorn Mark Harden being bound to execute a
 Deed for the same as may be seen by his certificate
 in the hands of John McManney for some where
 amongst my papers I forget which. It is also my
 wish if Joseph Woolfolk returns from his mother's
 expedition where he is at present gone that the said
 Thomas Woolfolk would pay him out of the property
 I have hereby given him five hundred dollars in
 cash or good property also that the said George
 Woolfolk may pay the said Joseph Woolfolk
 four hundred dollars in cash or good property out
 of the property which I have given him. I also
 give and bequeath unto the said George Woolfolk
 all debts due to me either by note bond or book

account he paying all my last debts and it is my particular wish that my debts may be discharged as soon as possible I also give the said George Woolfolk all my horses and it is my desire that he shall procure amoned Baker when the same is twelve years of age with an elegant horse saddle and bridle and also give any legacith unto the said Thomas and George Woolfolk all the property which I own not otherwise disposed of and this my last will and testament viz with property as I have omitted to mention above there is a tract of land in Green county on the waters of Green river containing 300 or 350 acres which I purchased for the taxes but have not obtained a Deed from the Register of this state yet the Deed and let the land be included in the last clause of this will, my meaning is that it be shared between the said Thomas & George. I give and devise my library to Thomas Woolfolk in testimony of this disposition of my property I have unto set my hand and seal this 12th day of September 1812
