First after all my last debts are paid I give and bequeath unto my kind & loving wife Barbara Dearinger the tract or parcel of land whereon I the said Michael Dearinger now lives surveyed for twenty acres be the same more or less to her or her to hold in peaceable possession until my son Matthew Dearinger comes to the age of twenty one years at which time he the said Matthew Dearinger is to have the above mentioned tract of land to him and his heirs forever also I give unto my loving wife Barbara all my household and kitchen furniture farming utensils and stock of horses cattle and hogs for the benefit of raising her son William Edwin and the above named Matthew Dearinger and when the above named Matthew Dearinger comes to the age of twenty one years he is to have the one half of the property above named (that is, the household and kitchen furniture farming utensils and stock of horses cattle and hogs which is then remaining after the above named Matthew Dearinger comes of age also I give & bequeath unto my beloved children John Dearinger Joseph Dearinger Jacob Dearinger Mary Matilda Elizabeth Ruess and Hannah Coggeshall one hundred acres of land lying

on the waters of Big Raceon Creek Rockcastle County to be equally divided betwixt them the six last mentioned children & I do hereby appoint Isaac Howard and Thomas Davis Sec^y my Executors to this, my last will and testament revoking all former will by me made in writing whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 13th day of May and in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & fourteen signed & sealed in the presence of us Michael Dearinger

to spare and my earnings and as to discharge
the Gifts that is hereafter given to my children
hereafter mentioned. Item I leave during her life
of my beloved wife Jane Grabe during her life
to and to her and for the raising and schooling
my children the tract of Land and a farm
house on which I now live and the house hold
furniture and farming utensils with the use of
all the negroes that is on the place and after
decease on marriage the sd. property to be divided
as is hereafter mentioned. Item I have already
given to my son George M. Grabe a tract of Land
in Adams County. I now give him a horse bridled
saddle a feather bed & furniture to him & his
chain and a sign for ever. Item I give to my
Daughter Elizabeth Grabe a horse Bridle &
Saddle feather bed and furniture which she has
received and a negro Girl by the name of Noddy
Item I give to my Daughter Polly Grabe a horse
man by the name of Ann a horse bridled and
saddle a feather bed and furniture which she has
already received to her and the issue of her body for
ever. Item I give to my Daughter Mary Grabe
three hundred and fifty dollars to purchase
a negro Girl with a horse bridled and saddle
a feather bed and furniture & her and to the
issue of her body for ever. And thus my
